PRASE Y - CAPTURE OF ST LO

On 1 July 19hh, the 29th Div, with a strength of 807 officers and 1h,290 MK, and attached: 7h th Tank Sn, G21st To Sn, G23rd To Sn, h59th AAA AD Dn, had accepted the line 1A F DUTREIS - L& SUTRAUA - 500 yds & GF LSD MSAAL MOUNTAIN - LA FUSSAKHICKE - 500 yds North of ST ANDRE DE 1 SPINE, a frontage of about 12,000 yds: the 175th Inf, with two bns in the line, on the right; 115th inf, with all three bns in the line, in the center; and litth Inf, with two bns, on the left, all engaged in active defense and aggressive patralling. On 2 July, the 115th Inf was able to withdress one bn to a reserve position behind the front line.

feasive esitions. Active patrolling was conducted continuously to the front and flanks. Several minor skirmishes developed during this time, but no significant changes in the front lines occurred. Frontline bettalions were rotated to reserve positions, with each regiment having one on in reserve at all times. Training was conducted, and replacements were absorbed in the reserve areas by these units. Juring this period a system was worked out to enable infantry reinforces with tanks to advance against the German "hadgerow defences."

on h July, at lax hrs, all gone of the liv and attached units that could be fired into every lines, fired one round as an Independence Day solute. This firing was done in conjunction with all other units on the Normandy Beachhead.

on the might 13-1h July, the relief of the 1st and 2nd Sns, 115th Inf, was started by the 35th Inf Div, and was completed by 1000 hours, 1h July. The Division boundary changed to the ST LU - MONS-SN-ELLS highway, which considerably narrowed the Division frontage. These two bns, 1st and 2nd of 115th Inf, completed move to assembly positions in the vicinity of LA FOND-RELIEE by 1130 hours, leaving the 3rd on in contact with the enemy in the vicinity IA LUZENNE. The 3rd Bn continued to occupy and defend this position. The 175th Inf and the 110th Inf completed occupation of ground gained and consolidated their positions.

On 15 July, the Division attacked at 0515 hours. The 115th Inf on the right attacked in column of bns in the order: let, 2nd Bns through the position held by the 3rd Bn. After an advance of 100 yds, the let an assemble of the left but was stopped when it came abreast of the let Bn. The 116th Inf attacked in column of bns, with their 3rd Bn passing through positions held by the let Bn. This bn advanced 100 yards beyond the LB and was stopped. The 175th Inf continued to defend the south and east flank of the Division with two bns in line, the 3rd Bn being withdrawn to Division Reserve south of ST ABDRE DE I SPINE. Their 2nd Bn, on the right flank, attacked southwest at 1650 hours, encountered heavy energy fire but advanced 100 yds before being stopped. At dark, 15 July, the 29th Div occupied the line: 600 yds southwest LA LUZERNE to 600 yds east of LA BOULAYE to streem north of LA BARRE-DE SEMILIAY to LA CALVAIRE.

buring the might 15-16 July, the 2nd Bn, litth Inf, advanced to the western alopes of the hill south of the stress junction at STE CHOIX DE ST 10 and dug in, organizing the hill for defense. It remained out off from the remainder of the regiment until the following day. Casualties in this action were comparatively high. Div Arty planes were used to drop blood plasms for the 35 wounded men with the Bn. The lat and 3rd Bns, litth Inf, organized and defended positions gained the day before.

An attack was received by the 1st and 3rd Sas at 1110 hours, 16 July, by force estimated to be 100 infantrymen. SP guns and flamethrowers; but the energy was thrown back with considerable loss of personnel and weapons. A second attack was made at 2150 hours by energy infantry and SP guns against these same two bus but was again beaten off before penstration was made. Energy artillary and mortar first continued to fall on all positions throughout the day. The 2nd Ba, 115th Inf., attacked at 0000 hours on the laft of the regimental sector and encountered strong energy resistance. The 1st Bn attacked on the right of the regimental sector at approximately 1100 hours to assist the advance of the 2nd Bn. Strong energy resistance was amountered from the outset by this bn also, and both bas were forced to take up defensive positions at about 1830 hours after a gain of but 300 yes. The 175th Inf occupied defensive positions on the south and east of the Division sector. An energy attack was received at 2115 hours in the area of the 2nd Bn, 175th Inf. The attack was besten off by fire and no penetration was made.

The Division continued the attack on the following day, 17 July. The 3rd Bn, 115th Inf, attacked at 0500 hours through the line held by the 2rd Bn, 115th Inf, act heavy resistence and was stopped without material gain. The let an, 115th Inf, attacked at 0700 hours on the right flank of the Division and was stopped after a short gain. The 2rd Bn then made a mide envelopment around the laft (east) flank of the regiment, attacking southwest through Mantinvilla, reaching a line generally 200 years west of Mantinvillas by mightfall. The 116th ind attacked with its 3rd Bn at 0130 hours, direction southwest towards at 10, and reached the high ground south of Mantinvillas at 0559 hours, to occupy the ground jointly with the 2rd Bn, 116th Inf, which had been on that position, at off from the rest of the regiment for 2h hours. At 10h5 hours, this bn continued the attack and gained a position on the outskirts of 3f 10 at 1400 hours. A strong energy counterattack with error was directed against this bn. At 2000 hours, the Co, 116th Inf, requested air support against the energy counterattack. C-3 and the Air Support Officer requested of First U. S. Aray, by telephone, through XIX Corps Air Sup cat Officer, that a mission be flown against the counterattack.

The 506th Fighter Bomber Squadron was ordered out and instructed to check in with the Miv Air Support Officer for final briefing in the air, which was done by radio at 2005 hours. The only rapid communications with the 3rd din was the Div Arty radio link.

The led ha, litth Inf, through Div Arty radio, we instructed to mark their front lines with red panels from the AF-50 panel set and undershirts, which was done. Sufficient markers were located by the pilots to enable them to determine frontline positions, and the German forces were hit. The close-support air attack was completed at 2145 hours. The CO, litth Inf, reported that the air attack was a success, having completely disorganized the German attack.

The 3rd Sn, 115th Inf, moved to occupy the high ground vicinity MASTINVILLS. The lifth Inf consolidated positions south of MARTINVILLS, which they had occupied the provious day. The 1st Sn organized carrying parties to supply the 2rd and 3rd Sns, which had been isolated; but by 1200 hours, this became unnecessary. The 1st Sn organized a defensive position north of LA BOULAYS.

Task force "C", organised the previous day, was elected at 1200 hours to move into and secure the city of ST 10. The force passed through the forward elements of the 115th Inf at 1500 hours, at which point the 1st im of the 115th Inf was attached. After severe fighting within the city, during which the Task Force Commander was wounded, ST 10 was occupied at 1900 hours. The Commanding General of the Division reported to the XIX Corps Commander: "I have the honor to announce to the Corps Commander that Task Force C of the 29th Infantry Division has secured the city of ST 10 after forty two days of continuous combat from Comba Beach to ST 10." As of 2000 hours that night, the strongth of the Division stood at 587 officers and 12,099 calisted men. During the proposeding ten days, 120 officers and 2200 onlisted men were constitles in action.

on 19 July, the Myssien consolidated its gains. At 7100 hours the preceding evening, the Task Force (less dets) had been attached to the 115th Inf. The let on, 115th Inf. continued the occupation of ST 10. Throughout the period of occupation it remained heavy artillery fire and was beabed and strated. The 2nd Sp. 115th Inf. relieved the 2nd and 3rd Sps. 116th Inf. in their positions; and the 3rd Sp. 115th Inf. continued to occupy positions east of ST 10. By 0530 bowes on 20 July, elements of the 15th Inf Div had completed relief of the 115th Inf man effected by 0915 hours. PHASE VI - PERIOD 21-27 FULT

During the period 21 to 27 July, replacements were absorbed and equipment was brought up to 7/8 ellowances. An intensive training program was instituted with particular explasis placed on methods of reducing hadgerow defences and on battle drills. Ours and classing of equipment, personal hygiene, physical and disciplinary training, critiques of action during dume, range firing of small was and machine gun drill were also stressed.

The Divinion Artillery, O'Zet TD Bm, 967th 74 Bm and 1,57th AAA AN Bm continued attachment to the 35th Inf Div, reducereding that fires in the LLA Garpe Sector until 1600 hours, 20 July, when 967th 7A Bm was released from attachment to the 29th Inf Div and reverted to XII Corps. Div Arty, 621st ED Bm, 159th AAS AN Bm were released from attachment to the 15th Inf Div and reverted to control of the 29th Inf Div. The 603rd TD Bm was attached to the Div, and the Div, with attached units, was alorted for sotor movement.

The First U. S. Arey had begun its breakthrough with armor and notorized infentry to the enemy rear. A penetration had been successfully made. XIX Corps on 20 July was to begin explaination of the breakthrough in its pass, west of the VINE Migras.

At 09h3 hours, 26 July, an order was received from LIX Corps, directing the Division to begin its advance to the south through ST LO at 1000 hours. Initially the Div was to move in one column from assembly eras cocupied during the period the Mivision was in Corps Reserve. The sovement of the Div was to be made in the wake of C Cond "A" (Rading), 2nd Armi Div. Crimal scheme was for the Division to move in two columns to the merch objective, both columns starting simultaneously. However, the eastern bridge was not completed on schedule; and the starting time and one column wave postponed several hours.

The Security Detachment (consisting of a rifle company, reinf, from the let Bu; 175th Inf) passed the initial point at the scheduled time and was followed by the main body at 1100 hours. Traffic south from ST LO was company-particularly in the city. The narrow streets were filled with pumble reconstanting movement.

At sidmight two bas of the 115th had closed in its forward assembly error. The remainder of the Complet Toom completed its move during the early hours of 29 July. Division Troops (consisting of: 227th FA Ba; 199th AAA AW Ba less Btrys A,B,C; 821st TD Ba T; 803rd TD Ba SP; 7h7th Tk Ba) moved on the mestern route in the rear of the 115th CT and completed its move into the former assembly area during the morning of 29 July. Sheay activity during the afternoon consisted of tank fire on our column at 14 BENISIERS and later, serial bombardment. The Division cancel to be notorized when it closed in forward assembly area.

The eastern and western routes of march converged at ST SAMSON DE BOW FUNDE, creating a very difficult traffic situation. The problem was made even more difficult because elements of C Cond "A", 2nd Arad Div, were operating at the same time and on the same roads. The problem was well handled, and the columns proceeded without mishap.

The plan for the Division for 29 July contemplated resumption of the advance at 0600 hours towards the Corps Objective. The lifth OT and the 175th OT were to advance abreast in the Division some in the wake of C Good "A" (Reinf), 2nd Arnd Div. The 115th OT was placed in Division Reserve with instructions to be prepared to advance on Division Order.

The litth CT advanced rapidly in its some against light resistance, and the 2nd and 3rd Bos reached the low ground running from LA PROVESTS (MALO). The lat Bo advanced to NOTEN, where it relieved the 2nd Bo, 66th Armsi Regt (Reinf) on its position during the night 29-30 July. The 175th CI soved south rapidly from the vicinity of LA WALLESS, the 2nd and 3rd Ame reaching the ground generally 1000 yds south of VILLEBAGEON - TERSY-SIM-VIRE road between high-bi-biolol. The let Bn edvenced repidly through LA TELANDIERE (b2bh) and relieved the 3rd Bn, 66th Ared Regt (Seinf) on the hill at bhil. It completed occupation of the forward slope of the bill at 2165 hours. The 2nd En, 175th Inf, moved in the rear of the lat and 3rd Ens initially and scoped up isolated groups of Germans who were passed by the other two bas. At 2200 hours, 29 July, the Regiment was creared to consolidate on positions gained. The Thirth Tk Dn was relieved of attachment by the Div Arty at 1200 hours. It reskined in Div Reserve in assembly area.

Initially there was little resistance to the edwance of the Division on 29 July. Leter, strong delaying action from positions generally to the south and eact, along the read running from PERCY to TRANS-SIM-VIRE, was empountered.

The 20th Inf Div moved into the Division sector, using as its axis of advance the LE MESNIL HERMAN - PERCY road. Heavy fire from German tanks and artillary in the vicinity of LA DENISIES groups and caused the 20th Inf Div edvance to lag. The let Dm, 130th Inf (20th Nv) was attached to the 130th Inf and was given the mission of Pechasing this remistance. The let Dm Ng moved to positions NE of the CR of LA DENISIES. Co 0, 116th Inf, attacked mest along the N-N road to LA DENISIES and cleaned out the group of energy infantry and tanks located there. This action allowed free use of the main N-S road to PERCY.
