PHASE VIII (CONT'D) - RECAPTURE OF THE FORTRESS BAST

1 - 10 September 1944

The VIII Corps continued the attack on Bast on 1 September 44, with the 25th Division on the right, the 2nd Division on the left and the 6th Division in the center. The 25th division on this date had the following attachments:

121st TD Bn (T)  
Co A, 61st Inf Co  
Irr A and S, 60th Cav Regt (attached to Task Force "Sugar")  
Co A, 75th Tk Bn (1 platoon attached to 175th Inf)  
(Co A, less one platoon, attached to Task Force "Sugar")  
2nd Ranger Bn (attached to Task Force "Sugar")  
Co A, 60th Cal Bn (attached to 110th Inf)

The division at 0700 hrs 1 September resumed the attack from the general line vic of ~~Kirchweiler~~ (91003) - ~~Hausen~~ (09100) - ~~Kirchweiler~~ (80553). The division had therefore reached and partially passed through the first main defensive line of the enemy with Hill 103 as one of the principal keys in this line as was conclusively proved by the determined resistance the enemy put up there. The 115th Infantry on the left held a frontage of 7,000 yards with the 1st and 2nd Bns in line. These two Bns fired heavy diversionary fires for this attack while the 3rd Bn in reserve continued the training of replacements. The attack of the 110th Infantry met extremely heavy resistance and the three Bns had gained little ground at 1015 hrs when the attack was halted. Intense artillery fire by the 2nd and 3rd regiments of the 175th Inf and the 2nd Ranger Regt. The 2nd Bn advanced 300 yds during the day while the 3rd Bn in the face of stiff opposition made no advance. The 1st Bn during this period continued holding up operations on Hill 103 (high ground at ~~Kirchweiler~~ (80553)). Task Force "Sugar" composed of the 2nd Ranger Bn, Irr A and S, 60th Cav Regt, 1 platoon, Co A, 121st Eng, C Bn, and Co A, 75th Tk Bn (less 1 platoon), continued to shell enemy strong points on the left and center, and successfully drove the 1st September to the line 600 yds in or ~~Kirchweiler~~ (75402) 300 yds off ~~Kirchweiler~~ (75407) - ~~Kirchweiler~~ (70575).

The 5th Ranger Bn (less Co A, C and S) was attached to the division at 0530 hrs 1 September and was given the mission of reducing enemy forces at ~~Kirchweiler~~ (75407) and ~~Kirchweiler~~ (70575). During this period Co A, 60th Cal Bn effectively supported the attack of both the 175th and 110th Infantry regiments.

At 1000 hrs 2 September, the 110th and 175th Inf Regts resumed the attack on Bast while the 115th continued holding the defensive line in its sector and fired every available weapon in the division attached, for diversionary purposes. The 3rd Bn 110th Infantry, Co A, maintained the training of its replacements and prepared for possible employment as division reserve. The 110th Infantry attacking with the 1st and 2nd Bns first met resistance. The 1st and 2nd Bns succeeded in taking some ground during the day, consolidating for the night on positions 300 yards off ~~Kirchweiler~~ (75407). The 175th Infantry in the center of the division, were also met extremely heavy resistance and the attack was halted at 2010 hrs on the forward slopes of Hill 103 approximately 600 yards off ~~Kirchweiler~~ (70575). The 3rd Bn, 110th Inf and Co A, 60th Cal Bn were attached to the 175th Inf at 1000.

Task Force "Sugar" continued the mission of reducing the ~~Kirchweiler~~ (75407) peninsula defenses, maintained pressure against the enemy and advanced slightly in the center of its zone. The French forces of the interior operated in co-operation with Task Force "Sugar" and patrolled vigorously.

3 September, the 2nd Division continued the attack to seize the eastern portion of Bast, the division objective.

The 1st and 2nd Bns, the attacking Bns of the 110th Infantry moved out under close artillery support. The plan was to have the artillery concentrations just ahead of the advancing troops and for the troops to take immediate advantage of this fire by advancing as soon as the fire was lifted. Operations for the day were concluded in the mid 16 of the afternoon, after registering hits of approximately 300 yds.

The 3rd bn, 115th Inf attacked at 0000 hrs and was given close support by Co A, 60th Cml Bn. Resistance at the outset was light, but heavier resistance developed as the attack progressed. A few hundred yards were gained and the close of operations found this Bn some 1800 yds E of LA THIENITE (Vc76960) and immediately SE of the notorious Hill 103 (Vc66998). The 3rd Bn, 175th also attacked at 0000 hrs, but made no gain and early in the afternoon, 3 September, was ordered to hold the line in their sector of the regimental zone. Later on that afternoon this Bn took over the area occupied by the two right flank Cos of the 115th Inf. This relief was completed at 2300 hrs, 3 September. The 1st and 2nd Bns were then withdrawn to assembly areas to receive and train replacements.

The 115th Infantry had a boundary change during this period. Part of the 2nd bn outside the new boundary (see Map #1) was relieved by elements of the 28th Infantry of the 8th Inf Div. The 3rd Bn 175th Inf relieved elements of the 1st Bn 115th Inf during the night as the right boundary of the 115th Inf also changed. Co A, 60th Cml Bn and 1 platoon, Co A, 70th Tk Bn were attached at 1600 hrs. Task Force "SUBAR" continued operations on the L. COQUET peninsula where gains were made in the center of the zone. The 5th Ranger Bn continued with the mission of destroying enemy forces located in the vicinity of QUINH BINH (V84947) and QUINH BINH - KHOU (V852943). At 1445 hrs 3 September this Bn captured the fort at (V852947) on QUINH BINH MOUNTAIN and continued the attack to the E.

All regiments during the day 4 September defended on the positions gained 3 September and prepared for the night attack scheduled to take place the night of 3-4 September.

The 115th Infantry (less 3rd bn) made extensive use of chemical mortars on enemy pill-boxes. One platoon of the 321st En Bn also assisted in this mission. The 110th Infantry, with the 1st and 2nd Bns attacking, jumped off at 2100 hrs on a limited objective attack. Resistance initially consisted of small arms fire, but strong enemy positions were met as the attack developed. A gain of 600 yards was made, however, placing this Bn in a position a few hundred yards E of LA THIENITE. The 3rd Bn 115th Inf, attached to the 175th Inf, was the attacking Bn in the 175th zone of action while the 1st and 2nd Bns, 175th Inf continued rehabilitation. The attack got under way on time and good progress was made. Some three hundred yards was gained on the left, while eight hundred yards were gained in the right sector of this Bn. This move gained the high ground S of Hill 103.

The remainder of the 5th Ranger Bn, formerly attached to the 2nd Division, reverted to its control. This Bn continued the reduction of enemy fortifications in the QUINH BINH - KHOU - QUINH BINH area. Approximately two thousand yards of the coast line in this area was cleared during this period.

Task Force "SUBAR" continued operation on the L. COQUET peninsula and during this period had advanced immediately W of COQUER (V800974) and W of QUINH BINH (V775900).

During this entire phase excellent close support was afforded the division by the Air Tactical Air Command. This support was achieved and coordinated by the Air Support Party attached to division. fighter-bombers operating in flights of four directly supported the division "on call" missions. They were very effective not only because of their destructive capabilities, but also because of the psychological effect on the enemy. This support was available on all days that the weather permitted and medium and heavy bombers furnished support through VIII Corps.

Co A, 60th Cml Bn was detached from the 115th Infantry attached to Task Force "SUBAR" at 1000 hrs. The 3rd Bn 110th Inf was also attached to the Task Force at this time.

During the day 5 September no further advance was attempted and the enemy was simply contained on all Regimental sectors. The following attachments were made during this period:

Co A, 60th Cml Bn, detached from 115th Inf at 1000 hrs  
3rd Bn, 110th Inf attached to Task Force "SUBAR" at 1600 hrs

The 5th Ranger Bn continued offensive operations along the coast and gained approximately two thousand yards.

The XIX Tactical Air Command on 6 September was extremely active in the Division zone and operated chiefly in the zones of the 115th Inf and Task Force "SUGAR". Eighteen missions were executed and 102.5 tons of bombs were dropped in addition to vigorous strafing of enemy positions. At 1500 hrs evidence of enemy withdrawal, attributable to the bombing was noted and the 1st and 2nd Bns 115th Inf advanced approximately nine hundred yards. The 1st Bn 116th Inf also advanced three hundred and fifty yards through slight resistance. The 175th Inf finding the same conditions of withdrawal to their front moved their 3rd Bn and the 3rd Bn, 115th Inf atched forward behind strong combat patrols. The close of this period therefore found the 29th Division advanced to the line: POINTE DU DIABLE (V894963) - 400 yds E of LA TRINITE (V897980) - 200 yds N of M'ALLON (Q890018) - 600 yds N of HERCULDY (Q915021).

Task Force "SUGAR" attacked 0830 hrs 6 September and gained eight hundred yards during the period which advanced the unit to an arc with its zenith centered on KERGUYID (V785973). One platoon Co, 116th Inf was attached at 1910 hrs.

The 7 September all Regiments continued the probing of enemy positions to establish the depth of their withdrawal and to "feel out" new strongpoints.

The 3rd Bn 115th Infantry was relieved by the 1st Bn, 175th Inf at 1900 hrs and closed into an assembly area in Regimental Reserve and later at 2230 hrs was relieved by the 2nd Bn, 175th Inf in position.

Task Force "SUGAR" attacked on 7 September with the 3rd Bn, 116th as the attacking element. Resistance stiffened as the attack developed and artillery fire was particularly heavy. The line running 200 yds W of KERGUYID (V785973) and M'GUARET (V785964) was reached however at the close of operations. The following attachments and detachments were made 7 September:

1 Platoon, Co A, 709th Tk Bn  
Co A, 121st Ranger C Bn (less 2 platoons)  
Co A, 6th Inf TD Bn SP  
224th FA Bn  
Btry C, 227th FA Bn  
Co A, 86th Ordn Bn relieved of attachment to Task Force "SUGAR" at 1600 hrs  
Co A, 86th Ordn Bn attached to 175th Inf at 1600 hrs.

The 175th and 115th Infantry Regiments were the attacking Regiments on 8 September in the attack that jumped off at 1000 hrs. The 116th Inf (less 3rd Bn) defended in this sector during this period and at 0930 hrs fired all mortars to assist the attack of the other Regiments. The 1st and 2nd Bns, 115th Inf also attacked at 1000 hrs. The 1st Bn registered a gain of 1200 yards and captured the old fort in the vic of Q922018. The 2nd Bn (attached 1 platoon, Co A, 709th Tk Bn) advanced 800 yards to capture the strongpoint KERGUYANT (Q927032).

The 2nd Bn, 175th Inf continued against heavier opposition and gained approximately 500 yards. The 3rd Bn sent out strong combat patrols and by this means the main body advanced 600 yards during the day.

Task Force "SUGAR" continued the attack through 8 September. The 3rd Bn, 116th Inf encountered moderate opposition and occupied the town of MOUZONVELIN (V775956) and the high ground in that vicinity. The 5th Ranger Bn through the extensive use of patrols advanced to occupy the ground in the vicinity of KERUGO (V780986). One platoon, Co A, 709th Tk Bn was relieved of attachment to the Task Force and attached to the 115th Infantry during this period. The 29th Cav Rcn Tr operated on the LE CONJUGET Peninsula and maintained contact between the 116th Inf, Task Force "SUGAR" and Cos B and F, 5th Ranger Bn. The Troop also operated Or's along the coast from POINTE DE CREACHEUR (V780946) to PORT DE DELLEC (V890958).

The 115th Infantry (less 3rd bn) and with 1 platoon, Co A, 709th Tk Bn attached began its attack on the 9 September at 0900 hrs. The 1st bn on the right defended in its zone. The 2nd bn was the attacking unit for the regiment and advanced on the left flank to capture the town of KAM (927020) and then in the late afternoon this bn was relieved by the 1st. At 1500 hrs the 3rd bn was relieved of attachment to the 175th Infantry and began the occupation of that area held by the 3rd bn 175th Infantry.

The 2nd bn was also the attacking bn for the 175th Infantry 9 September. Heavy small-arms fire was met and very little gains were registered during the day. The 3rd bn contained the enemy in the positions secured on 8 September. The change in boundary between the 115th and the 175th Inf Regts was effective at 2230 hours and the 3rd bn 175th, after it was relieved by the 3rd bn, 115th Inf, moved to an assembly area in regimental reserve. The 116th Infantry with the 2nd bn in line assisted the advance of the regiment on the left, the 175th Inf, by fire while the 1st bn continued rehabilitation training with emphasis on battle and bayonet drills.

Task Force "SOMAR" on this day employed in its attack from left to right the 3rd bn, 115th Inf, 2nd Ranger Bn, 5th Ranger Bn (less Cos C & D). Early in the morning enemy opposition was very determined but in the late morning hours the enemy forces broke and all units of the Task Force advanced with small opposition. At 1330 hrs the commander of the L Co, 5th RCT (V733982) garrison surrendered the peninsula. This left only a few isolated strongpoints and the Task Force made preparations to reduce these the following day.

10 September was occupied largely in the shifting of forces and boundaries. The 175th Infantry, however, continued the attack at 0700 hrs. The 2nd bn as the attacking unit could make no headway, so at 1130 hrs the 1st bn was committed through the 2nd bn and succeeded in gaining some five hundred yards. This established the regiment on the line 1700 yds N of KAM V.D.M. (927020).

The 115th Infantry maintained pressure against the enemy and at 2310 hrs that evening the 8th Division officially took over the 115th area and the 1st and 3rd bns moved to an assembly area just S of the CRUCIT M (V652990). The 2nd bn moved directly from their assembly area to relieve the 1st bn, 175th Inf on position. One platoon, Co A, 709th Tk Bn was relieved from attachment to the 115th Inf at 1100 hrs and attached to the 175th Infantry. The 116th Infantry was placed in division reserve after the 2nd bn had been passed through by the 175th Infantry. Rehabilitation training, therefore, occupied the entire regiment. This period saw a shift of the division to the south as VIII Corps closed in on Da Nang.

Task Force "BOGAR" on 10 September eliminated the last resistance on the LS CO. USF Peninsula by taking the fort at LA 004 BLANGHE. (V731987)

The boundary between the 2nd and 8th Infantry Divisions changed during this period. VIII Corps plan called for the 8th Division to be relieved by the 2nd Division, thereby relieving the 8th for operations on the CRUCIT Peninsula.

The 115th and 175th Inf Regts each attacked with their 2nd bns on 11 September at 1030 hrs. The 115th Inf met generally heavy resistance throughout the day but continued the attack until 2045 hours at which time vertical gridline 39 was reached (line extending due N from Fort DE BIEC (V690950)). At 1100 hrs this day 1 plt, Co A, 709th Tk Bn was detached from the 115th Inf and attached to the 175th Inf. The 3rd bn, 115th Inf moved to an assembly area S of the village in the afternoon in preparation for an attack on 12 September. At 1600 hrs Co C, 115th Inf was struck.

The 175th Infantry was also forced to advance slowly due to heavy small arms and mortar fire and that evening at 2000 hours had reached positions at LA 004 (V690950) where the bn halted and reorganized on position for the resumption of the attack. The 1st bn jumped off one hour later than the 2nd bn. Extremely heavy small-arms fire was met but 300 yds were gained before the bn halted in the early afternoon. This bn then took up the attack at

1630 hours but very little gain was registered.

The 116th Inf continued to move in one hour paying special attention to training in assault of fortified positions.

Small force "Lobka" having completed the reduction of the fort, Fort Benini-Sau was officially discontinued at 1000 hours this day and all units reverted to fort culture, the 116th major in reverting to division control.

Both A and B Cos, both 3rd Bn rendered valuable fire support to the 115th and 175th Infantry regiments. Experience with these two Cos proved conclusively the value of mass firing by platoon. Such a concentration was found more effective and because fires were delivered for a shorter period, the mortars were consequently harder to locate. On occasion here only one in the regiment was attacking, the fire of these platoons could be made to bear on a single target (summit road, magazine etc). Such an action was accomplished by setting up a simple fire direction center and by using 108 300 rounds, one with the gunner observer, one with the fire direction center & one in the platoon itself. An experience had also shown that the enemy expected us to place our mortars in areas in ravines, the best location for there was found to be well up on the reverse slope of a hill. The four mortars in the platoon are placed 50 yards apart and usually all mortars use the same azimuth. On occasion, however, the fire of all mortars is converged by using the deflection table. For registration all four mortars register one round on the base point and when the registration mortar is fired all mortars correct with the same data as the registration mortar.

The 115th Infantry resumed the attack just after midnight on 11 September and had not made a penetratory line yet at 0500 hrs 12 September. The 3rd Bn attacked through the 2nd in the late morning hours with the objective of securing this segmental objective. Fort Mazzini (V907907) was captured by the 3rd on sheer stiff resistance was overcome. The 1st bn was committed on the 2nd of the 3rd and at the end of the day this bn had reached a line 200 yards ... of fort Mazzini (G917907). The attack by the regiment on this day, therefore, had netter gains of approximately 1200 yards on the 1st and 1000 yards on the 2nd. Ypres 3rd BN (less 1 platoon) was attached at 2100 hours to the 115th Inf.

The 116th and 3rd (Bvfrs)(Br) was attached to the Division at 0001 hrs 12 September and then at 2100 hrs was attached to the 116th Inf. This Bn was equipped with "crocodile" flame-throwing tanks and the 116th Infantry Regiment trained with this squadron in the assault on fortified positions in preparation for possible employment in the 175th zone of action.

1st bn on the left, 2nd bn on the right constituted the attacking formation of the 175th infantry as the regiment continued the attack begun in the early morning hours of 12 September. The 1st bn captured the town of Malin (886002) a 0900 hrs and continued the attack with slight opposition, and by mid afternoon when the attack was halted had reached a line approximately 100 yards ... of fort Benini (V905995). The 2nd bn also met comparatively little opposition during the day and by nightfall this bn held the line beginning 800 yards ... of fort Benini and extending approximately 300 yards NE.

The 29th Cav Regt maintained contact between the FRI and Cos B, 3rd Bn until 2000 hrs this day when the troops shifted to the east to maintain contact between the 175th Inf and the 20th Inf, 8th Div on the left. This day therefore saw the continuation of the penetration of the enemy's second main defense line with the forts Mazzini and Benini as the main bastions.

During the night 12-13 September the enemy reoccupied fort Benini with small force. The 1st and 3rd bns, 116th Inf attacking abreast at 0500 hrs 13 September gained no ground due to heavy opposition. During the entire period the enemy continued attacks to regain the ground lost of the "V" ditch at fort Benini, but all attacks were unsuccessful. The 116th Inf moved into a forward assembly area in preparation for going into the line between the 115th and 175th

Infantry Regiments. At the close of the day 13 September, the 1st Bn 116th Inf was in the process of relieving elements of the 1st Bn 115th Inf in the vicinity of Fort MONTBAREY.

The 2nd Bn 175th Inf launched an attack at 1100 hrs aimed at Fort KERANROUX (V915995). In just 20 minutes the capture was complete and at darkness the Bn consolidated just S of the fort. Co A, 36th Tk Bn was relieved of attachment to the 175th and attached to the 116th Inf at 1800 hrs.

The 8th Infantry Division after being pinched out moved to the CROZON Peninsula and the 2nd Division was then on the left of the 29th and the 29th Cav Regt maintained contact with them. The 5th Ranger Bn operated on the Division's right flank with a protective mission and they were supported by 1 plat, Co A, 614th TD Bn SP who effectively neutralized emplacements at V904970.

Relief of the 1st Bn 115th Inf by the 1st Bn 116th Inf was completed at 1400 hrs. The 3rd Bn 115th Inf was relieved by the 2nd Bn 115th Inf at 140105 hrs. All regiments of the Division attacked at 0800 hrs on 14 September.

The 2nd Bn 115th Inf was unsuccessful in the first attack and gained no ground but at 1100 hrs Hill 91 (V900960) just SW of Fort MONTBAREY was taken. That night the enemy counter-attacked and regained the hill. The 116th Inf attacked in a column of Bns with the 1st Bn leading. At noon the 3rd Bn was committed on the left and succeeded in capturing enemy emplacements along the LAMMERMARIE - RECOUVRANCE road (V920968). At 1615 hrs the 1st Bn in conjunction with the "crocodile" flame-throwing tanks of the 115th RAQ Sqdn attacked and captured positions in the vicinity of Fort MONTBAREY. The Regiment was buttoned up for the night at 2030 hrs in an arc approximately 400 yds to the SE of Fort MONTBAREY.

The 1st Bn 175th Inf attacked towards the butts of the Naval Firing Range which they succeeded in capturing at 1230 hrs. The 2nd Bn whose initial objective was the CR (at V921993) completed its initial mission and in the late afternoon consolidated for the night. The 3rd Bn was committed at 1454 hrs. This Bn passed through the other two and captured its objective (at V935998). The 5th Ranger Bn (less Co B) continued the protection of the right flank of the 29th Division and advanced to conform with the advance of the 115th Inf on its left.

During most of the 15 September the 115th Inf continued to hold defensive positions W of Hill 91 which the enemy had regained the night before. At 1615 hrs the 1st Bn moved through the zone of the 116th Inf to attack from main rd S of Fort MONTBAREY towards the rear of the fortifications on the hill. The attack was successful and the Bn stopped for the night. The 2nd Bn which assisted by fire the attack of the 1st moved forward on the flank of the 1st Bn. The 3rd Bn (less Co L) also moved into the zone of the 116th Inf and attacked at 1915 hrs due S from the main road at CR PIERRAS (V914988). 50 yds were gained and at 2330 hrs the Bn halted along the line (V911982 - V914982). At 2110 hrs Co L was attached to the 5th Ranger Bn.

The 1st Bn, 116th Inf continued to mop up enemy positions on the perimeter of Fort MONTBAREY and succeeded in encircling the fort itself. The 3rd Bn attacked at 1000 hrs this day and succeeded in gaining approximately 800 yds. The 175th Inf with one plat Co A, 709th Tk Bn attached maintained defensive positions and attacked in the vicinity of the Naval Firing Range. The 1st Bn continued in defense of the butts of Naval Firing Range NW of RECOUVRANCE and also protected the left flank of the Regiment. The 2nd Bn continued the defense of Fort KERANROUX and protected the right flank of the Regiment. The Bn attacked and by the end of the day 15 September had reached positions just S of the SE end of the Naval Firing Range.

The 5th Ranger Bn on the Division right flank encircled le Creuguet (903974) and here they buttoned up for the night.

At 1000 hrs on 16 September the 115th Inf once more resumed the attack on RECOUVRANCE with the 1st and 3rd Bns abreast, 1st Bn on the right. Enemy fire from numerous pillboxes was very heavy and the attack was halted until 1200 hrs when the 1st Bn again jumped off and seized the high ground 150 yds SE of KERNELEN (V922978). The 2nd Bn moved to a forward assembly area and reached the LD at 1440 hrs. At 1945 hrs it attacked and gained 300 yds just SE of

KERNELA. The 3rd Bn 115th also resumed the attack at 1107 hrs and succeeded in taking the high ground N of KERDALOOS (V914977). Co L was relieved of attachment to the 5th Ranger Bn at 1200 hrs and Co B, 66th Cml Bn supported the attack of the 1st and 3rd Bns during this period.

The mission of the 116th Inf was to reduce enemy resistance in RECOUVRENCE S of the Naval Firing Range. The attacking formation used was 2nd and 3rd Bns abreast with each Bn in a column of Companies. Progress was necessarily slow as house-to-house fighting was the type engaged in, but resistance was generally light. The 1st Bn operating with the 111st RAC Sqdn took Fort MONTBARTY at 1725 hrs 16 September. Opposition here had been very determined and its fall was of major importance as it was one of the main points in the enemy defensive line. Co A, 66th Cml Bn was detached from the 116th Inf at 1430 hrs and attached to the 8th Division.

The 1st Bn, 175th Inf relieved the 3rd Bn of the defense of Fort KERDALOOS and mopped up enemy emplacements NE of the firing range. The 2nd Bn at 1000 hrs attacked toward the city wall of RECOUVRENCE and at 1900 hrs crossed the wall to occupy the city of REKET. The 3rd Bn, after mopping up resistance at the S end of the firing range, reached the city wall also and contacted the 2nd Bn. The 5th Ranger Bn captured LE COSQUER (V903974) and made preparations to seize RUINTE DU MONTZIC. Cos B and C reverted to 5th Ranger Bn control at 1500 and 1720 hrs respectively.

On 17 September all Bns of the 115th Inf attacked at 1000 hrs with the 1st on the right and the 2nd Bn on the left with the mission of seizing the high ground immediately N of KERDALOOS (V914977 - V920977) and the submarine pens (V923972). In front of the 1st Bn the enemy had many pillboxes from which heavy small arms fire was delivered and consequently the attack was held up. Tank Destroyer fire was not effective against these steel pillboxes.

The 2nd and 3rd Bns 116th Inf attacked at 1000 hrs also and at 1500 hrs the 1st was committed on the right. At the close of the day's operation the Regiment held the high ground overlooking the beach and drydocks, roughly 150 yards from the HADE DE BREST. During the night the 116th fired illuminating flares at 30 minute intervals over the breakwater so as to keep observation on this enemy escape route. The 111st RAC Sqdn (Buff's Dr) was detached from the 116th Inf and attached to the 115th Inf at 1600 hrs.

The 175th Inf (1 plat Co A, 709th Pk Bn attached) continued the mopping up of enemy resistance inside the city wall to the river and some resistance N along the Penfeld river. The 5th Ranger Bn was held up also by enemy pillboxes and also found that T-6s were ineffective against them. One combat patrol from this Bn the night of the 17 September knocked out one pillbox with an 80 lb. beehive charge, but heavy enemy fire prevented the blowing of any others.

An enemy delegation of four officers approached the lines of the 115th Inf at 0730 hrs 18 September and asked for surrender terms. They were informed that there were no surrender terms and that if they wanted to surrender to come out immediately with their hands up. At 0800 hours all organized resistance ceased and the enemy surrendered in small groups to our forces. The 111st RAC Sqdn reverted to III Corps control at 2024 hrs.

Thus ended the successful attack on the fortress held with the 29th Division capturing KERDALOOS and that portion of Brest E of the RENAUD river on 16 September. The 2nd Division took the portion of the city N of the RENAUD river the same day and on the 20th September the 8th Division cleared all enemy resistance from the RENAUD peninsula. This campaign netted approximately 37,000 prisoners and freed one of the largest ports in France. In capturing this city the 29th Division met extremely heavy defensive positions and the crack enemy troops of the II rars Regt and succeeded in batting both.

On 15 September the 116th Inf consisting of the 111th RAC Sqdn, Co B, 121st Eng Regt Bn and Co A, 1016th Inf Bn took over from the other two regiments the protection of the Division zone while the 115th and 175th Inf regts moved to an assembly area in the RENAUD peninsula. At 2000 hours our troops assumed responsibility for the entire RENAUD and KERDALOOS sections in the Division zone and the 116th RAC also moved to an assembly area.
